SARASOTA PRAYER BREAKFAST TO FEATURE NATIONAL SPEAKER AND MUSICIAN

Sarasota's 47th annual Community Prayer Breakfast is fast approaching. The date is Thursday, March 28, 2019 at a new time: 8:00 a.m. This year it is being held at the Sarasota Hyatt Hotel.



This year's keynote speaker is David Barton, Founder and President of WallBuilders.



WallBuilders is a national pro-family organization that presents America's forgotten history and heroes, with an emphasis on our moral, religious and constitutional heritage.

David is the author of numerous best-selling books, with the subject being drawn largely from his massive library of tens of thousands of original writings from the Founding Era. He also addresses over 400 groups each year.

His exhaustive research has rendered him an expert in historical and constitutional issues and he serves as a consultant to state and federal legislators, has participated in several cases at the Supreme Court, was involved in the development of the History/Social Studies standards for states such as Texas and California, and has helped produce history textbooks now used in schools across the nation.

Also known as "America's Historian," TIME magazine called David "a hero to millions – including some powerful politicians."

NEWSMAX named David as one of America's top 100 influential evangelicals, and TIME magazine named him as one of America's 25 influential evangelicals.

David has received numerous awards and honors. He has been seen on Fox News and other news outlets. Glenn Beck says of him: "David Barton is the most important person you will ever know."

The breakfast was chaired by Sen. James Lankford, R-Okla., and Sen. Chris Coons, D-Del.




Following remarks by Donald Trump, the two men surrounded the President and prayed over him.

The Importance of Small Groups

There is a long standing tradition of believers meeting in small groups. Close relationships are formed where members support each other - rejoicing in good times and lending encouragement in tough times. Small groups can accomplish great things. Centuries ago a small group of 12 men spread the good news which changed the world.

The roots of the National Prayer Breakfast can be traced back to a small group of local business leaders in Portland, Oregon that got together for fellowship and to seek God's guidance in solving problems that were facing the city. Out of this group came the beginnings of Goodwill Industries. This grew into the formation of small groups all across the nation reaching even into the US Congress.

Each week in Washington, D.C. members of the Senate and members of the House of Representatives meet informally in small groups in the spirit of Jesus of Nazareth. That is to say they put aside their political differences and come together to build personal relationships with God and with each other through fellowship and prayer. The same thing happens each week in Tallahassee with members of our Florida state congress.



Here in Sarasota a small group was started 47 years ago, out of which came the annual Sarasota Prayer Breakfast.

If you are not a member of a small group – we encourage you to join or start one. A group can be as simple as two or three getting together on a weekly basis at a restaurant or common meeting place. A group can be just for men, just for women, or co-ed. A group can meet for a variety of purposes: for fellowship; prayer; spiritual study, or even take on a project.

The Sarasota Prayer Breakfast will help you start a group. Our members will attend a few initial meetings to get you started. You can pick the time and location. We have some guidelines on how to conduct a group that we will be happy to share with you.

What is the Sarasota Prayer Breakfast, Inc.?



We have been an intricate part of the Sarasota community for almost one-half century. God has used the Sarasota Prayer Breakfast to be a catalyst to bring us together in unity. We are patterned after the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, D.C.
